FOOD

Temporary and emergency basis



FISH maintains a Food Pantry at Hill Funeral Home that stores supplies needed for Food Calls. Each call costs FISH about \$63.00 in addition to the donated items. Supplies also include hygiene, paper, laundry and cleaning products. Food calls have risen from an average of 15 per month in 2009 to the 2014 level of 35 per month.

CLOTHES CLOSET:

Perry Center – 2nd Floor 1st Wednesday of the Month (September – June) 5:00 – 6:30 pm



The closet provides free clothing for the children in our community as inventory allows. In addition, FISH partners with the Salvation Army's Coats for Kids to insure they stay warm in the colder months. The closet distributes clothing for 40-45 persons per month.

FEED THE BUS:

(Held Spring and Fall to stock Food Pantry)

The Spring Drive is held the 1st Saturday in June and the Fall Drive which is partnered with Bauman's Running Center is held in November the Saturday before Thanksgiving.

To Qualify, you must

Baskets are available to qualifying families thru community sponsorships. They include food for a holiday meal, sufficient quantities to carry families through the time students are out of school. In addition, hygiene, paper, laundry and cleaning products are included. Gifts are purchased for the children as well. The suggested average cost for sponsorship (depending on family size) starts at \$125 to purchase basket items and \$75 per child in gifts/clothing items.

BACK to SCHOOL NIGHT:

(Limited to previous year Christmas Basket recipients)

The Salvation Army's Back Pack Program partners with FISH and FISH provides school supplies including pens, pencils, crayons, glue, scissors, paper, notebooks, etc in each Pack.

Back Packs are distributed in August prior to the school year beginning. Recipients receive shoe certificates, and a visit to the Clothes Closet where they also are given a new outfit including underwear and socks.



SHOE DRIVE:

New and Gently Used Shoes Winter Boots

A Community-wide new/gently used Shoe Drive is conducted each Spring the 1st Saturday in June for a free shoe distribution on the same day as the Elementary Open Houses the following school year.
